Supervisor Drake opened the Public Hearing at 6:30 p.m. Town Clerk Schweikert had published the Notice of Public Hearing in the Springville Times on November 22, 2019. The Public Hearing Notice was posted on the signboard at the Town Hall and on the Town's website: townofconcordny.com on November 15, 2019.

There are five separate Contracts: Boston Volunteer Fire Company, Inc.; East Concord Volunteer Fire Company, Inc.; Mortons Corners Volunteer Fire Company, Inc.; Village of Springville Fire Company, Inc. (fire and Emergency Medical Services) and East Concord Volunteer Fire Company, Inc. Ambulance Service. All five Contracts are three-year terms effective January 2020 to December 2022 with 3% increases. These amounts are in the 2020 Budget. The percentages for all Agreements are the same.

Supervisor Drake asked if anyone had any questions. No one wished to address the Board.

Supervisor Drake advised Mr. Graves that Councilman Drozd has been in contact with Erie County Soil & Water Conservation District with regard to the Mortons Corners Fire Company's installation of a dry hydrant on the Winger property on Spaulding Road. Councilman Drozd was able to secure engineer services for the Company for free. The installation of a dry hydrant does fall under the scope of duties for the Soil & Water Conservation District's duties. Councilman Drozd has already been in contact with the Chief and Line Officer 9-2 with this information. Mr. Graves thanked Councilman Drozd. Councilman Zittel questioned if the installation of a dry hydrant would help with the Company's ISO rating; Mr. Graves did not know; Supervisor Drake did not think it would.

Motion made by Councilman Drozd, seconded by Councilman Zittel, to close the Public Hearing at 6:45 p.m. Councilmen Krezmien, Zittel, Snyder & Drozd; Supervisor Drake, voting aye. Carried. Supervisor Drake thanked the fire companies for their service to the community.
