Work Session 6:30 p.m.

June 9, 2022

Supervisor Drozd opened the Work Session:

1. Supervisor Drozd stated that Joanne Walker gave her verbal resignation as attendant PT at the Senior Center to Eleanor Eschborn but her written resignation had not yet been received. We will remove part 2 of letter b under new business for the board meeting.

2. Supervisor Drozd provided the Board with an update on the matter concerning the Mortons Corners Cemetery. In 2017, Mr. Monroe Pfarner was buried in a plot that had been purchased by the Jirak family in 1906. The great-grandson of Mrs. Jirak, the purchaser of the plot, is requesting remuneration for the error. The family has no intention of using the plot in question, but they would like to be compensated for it.

Discussion as to what amount is fair to offer and how the check should be written. Who has a right to the money now that the original purchaser is deceased? Town Attorney Attea suggested he write a letter requesting documentation for the estate showing who the legal beneficiary would be. Once this documentation has been received, the amount of remuneration will be decided.

3. Supervisor Drozd received documents from Pam Batterson, widow of former Town Historian, Dave Batterson. All documents are being returned to the Historical Society and stamped "Property of the Town of Concord."

4. The pump at the KB sewer plant failed. A new pump has been ordered.

5. Supervisor Drozd said that Tim Domes has been putting in extra time at the Kissing Bridge water district but it has been necessary. He had to replace a sump pump and faucet but was able to find the lowest price on the parts. He's doing a great job.
