

TOWN OF CONCORD TOWN BOARD
Work Session

March 10, 2022

Supervisor Drozd discussed the following items with the Board:

1. Supervisor Drozd advised that the sewer line repair that the Board authorized last month has been completed. Supervisor Drozd showed the Board the pictures taken of the obstruction in the line.

2. Supervisor Drozd will be reviewing the Senior Director Report during the meeting but wanted to share with the Board that the Center was closed for 2 days so the steel braces could be installed for the room divider. The Center will be closed for 3 days when the company will be there putting the divider in place. Supervisor Drozd showed the Board pictures he had taken at the Center; there are cracks in the wall that will need to be repaired.

3. Supervisor Drozd received the DEC report to satisfy the work at the Highway Garage. During the meeting tonight, he will ask the Board for a motion to put the project out for bid.

4. The Board had included in the 2022 Budget the purchase of a zero-turn mower. Hwy Supt Edwards and his department will take over the mowing of the cemetery and Senior Center instead of bidding it out. This will save the Town money. As part of the highway department taking over the mowing, Supervisor Drozd would like to compensate Hwy Supt Edwards for overseeing the mowing in the amount of \$1,000. This compensation will be added to the agenda.

5. Council Member Krzemien attended the Boston Fire Company meeting and the Company would like Erie County to put a four-way stop at the intersection of Brown Hill Road and Zimmerman Road. The Boston Fire Company recently built a new fire company building and feel this sign is necessary for safety. The Boston Fire Company is requesting the Town Board send a resolution to Erie County in support of this sign placement. There is not a history of accidents at this intersection but with the location of the new building, Supervisor Drozd is hopeful that Erie County will review based on the building location as a public safety matter vs. the history. Council Member Krzemien noted that the firemen said the vehicles fly by in that area. Council Member Zittel said one of the biggest things is that the fire trucks will be backing in the parking lot. Supervisor Drozd noted that there is also a dip in the road in the section of the road by the cemetery; need to make sure everyone is safe.

6. Supervisor Drozd advised that the KB Water District is on the agenda tonight for some personnel changes. Our new water operator, Timothy Domes, just started this week and started on Monday that there was a huge leak; waited a day to see what happens. The next day it was about 2,000-2,300 gallons more than any previous day. Mr. Domes looked around, went to all the houses on Bridgetop and could not find anything. Later in the day, Supervisor Drozd and Mr. Domes met with Jim Thoman and they walked up the hill and it was getting wetter and wetter and they located the massive leak. Mr. Domes had the homeowner's phone number and she was able to meet them. When the basement door was opened, the water came out like Niagara Falls. Her hot water tank blew on the bottom so the cold water was coming in and building up in her basement. There was about a 12,000-gallon loss in about four days. They turned the cold water off and the homeowner will get a plumber in to repair. Supervisor Drozd showed the Board the pictures he had taken.

7. Supervisor Drozd advised that the Town received the \$8,000 from Erie County that Deputy Supervisor Drake applied for with regard to the Comprehensive Plan and Solar Law. This is the reimbursement to the Town for the Wendel Companies services.
