

Supervisor Drozd discussed the following with the Board:

1. The members were provided with the updated ARPA Fund sheet. The blinds came in for the Senior Center as ordered by the installer and measured by the installer; and they are wrong. The blinds are being reordered. The balance is \$140,765.39. Nothing else was spent awaiting the figures from the Community Park project.

2. National Fuel did repair the Bensley Center lawn and Custodian Ott has been watering it to get the lawn started at the Center. Supervisor Drozd spoke with Council Member Clyde after having heard that a resident went out behind the Hulbert Library and sprayed some weed killer to kill the grass to plant a garden for flowers. Supervisor Drozd advised the resident that the building is not owned by the Library Board and he cannot be spraying chemicals. The resident apologized and will reseed the lawn. The Highway Department went there yesterday to repair the winter plow damage. Custodian Ott will water the lawn once it is seeded.

3. There was a mower problem at the Hulbert Library. The Library Caretaker paid for by Erie County mows the lawn over there but the mower belongs to the Town. A new mower was purchased for use at the Town Hall and the old one was serviced, blades sharpened and it is now at the Hulbert Library for use. There is also an old snow thrower at the Library purchased by past Supervisor Eppolito so the next time the Town sends surplus equipment to Auctions International, this snow thrower will be included as well as the old mower. When the school has the Day of Caring, there will be some students at Community Park and some will also go to the Hulbert Library. Deputy Highway Supt Heim is involved with this being an FFA Advisor so he will have one of the Town's trucks there and rake out back and pick up the sticks and litter. There has been a neighbor complaint so we will get that cleaned up. He thinks the date is the first week of June.

4. The Williamson Law Book payroll software program was not renewed. This saved the Town \$1,001. If you put that toward the cost of the payroll service, that costs the Town about \$1,500.

5. Erie County has the bids out for the south Trevett Road project. The pre-bid meeting was held today and the bid opening is next Thursday. This project is to be completed this construction season so the County is anticipating a July start date.

6. Supervisor Drozd had a meeting yesterday with Community Bank representatives Anthony Lanza and Mary Ann Lutz. The Town has one small account with their bank. Mr. Lanza is the new Municipal Banking Officer and has his office here in Springville. Community Bank matches NYCClass. Supervisor Drozd will review this with Council Member Drake. Adjustments are made around the 1st and 15th of the month instead of daily. The Town was on the cusp of changing accounts around but will review this before any changes to NYCClass.

7. Community Park update: Matt Darnley, Deadwood Tree Service, donated his time last Sunday at Community Park and leveled out the ground by the new Pavilion. Council Member Zittel donated some seed. Mr. Darnley called in one of his crew to assist. The 4 or 5 stumps outside the restrooms will be taken out and he purchased the seed and fertilizer. Supervisor Drozd does not think he should donate all of that; Mr. Darnley submitted a bill for \$1,200 and Supervisor Drozd approved that billing. Council Member Krzemien asked what else was going on at the Park? Will the Pavilion be ready for next Sunday? Supervisor Drozd advised that the DASNY grant check for \$100,000 is going to be cut on Tuesday, May 16th. He has had contact with the same representative as last time and the representative said the check should be received by Thursday or Friday via mail. Then the remaining balance of grant money to be received by the Town is \$16,000. Supervisor Drozd spoke with Fritz Ehmke, Ehmke Well Drillers, earlier today. The water testing is not completed yet. Some of it is, but some is not

because it has to sit. It may be done tomorrow or Monday. After that Enviro-Tech will get those results to Mr. Ehmke and Mr. Schenne so that Mr. Schenne can design the system and this will be delivered to the Erie County Health Department by either Mr. Schenne or Supervisor Drozd as soon as it is designed. Erie County assured the Town they will review it promptly. Council Member Zittel advised that the Town is still looking at a month. Supervisor Drozd is hoping for the end of June; his goal now is to have it ready for July 2nd for the fireworks event. Supervisor Drozd noted that the first goal was Opening Day for SYI Baseball but we are exactly six weeks behind schedule by all this water situation that is out of the Town's control. Alliance Homes has the countertops installed and the dividers but they are holding off on the rest until the Town finds what about the water system. The steel is on site; the overhang may be completed in steel. Supervisor Drozd advised that the electric meter has to be moved outside as well. The new building will all be keyed alike and the electric company should not have access to all the rooms in the new Pavilion. Supervisor Drozd also spoke with Chris Knospe, NYSEG Government Liaison, regarding the lights at Community Park. Before more discussion about the lights, Supervisor Drozd advised the Board that the Town is on a demand charge at the KB Sewer Plant; so the Town is getting hit with a demand charge every month of \$177; with a total bill of \$289. It is hoped that the Town can get out of this demand charge. The Members were provided with details as to how the demand charges work and high estimates for using the lights three times a week for three hours times four weeks. The demand charge deals with the size and the amount of the current a system can carry. It is not certain how much this system can carry. Town Clerk Schweikert found all the blueprints for the lights and this will be reviewed. This will not be solved tomorrow; it will be a long process to figure out. Supervisor Drozd did talk to the grant department and there are no current grants for arena lights. He did speak with Tom Chapman and he did confirm the process of putting on the lights. Do them one at a time; do not do them together. Put on one then wait 15-20 seconds and do the second one in sequence. Council Member Krzemien asked Supervisor Drozd if he had spoken to SYI about the building and the lights as well; he did not. Council Member Krzemien advised that their first tentative night game is June 2nd. Supervisor Drozd said that is not going to happen. Council Member Krzemien noted that once the Town gets this to work, that the cost of the lighting could come out of the budget amount that SYI receives in the Town's budget. Supervisor Drozd will work on trying to get that demand charge down. Supervisor Drozd will take out blueprints of the lighting to NYSEG and try to get this figured out. Does NYSEG have any paperwork as to how much current the system can even carry? What is it set up for? Chapman's bucket truck will not reach the lights but NYSEG gave Supervisor Drozd a couple contractors that he could reach out to look. Council Member Drake reminded the Board that when SGI gets their new field ready, how much will the school be using Community Park. Supervisor Drozd and Park Supt Schweikert met with the SGI Athletic Director and their groundskeepers and SGI is now helping Park Supt Schweikert with the work on the Varsity Field. SGI gave the Town their old pitcher's mound for the field. Supervisor Drozd advised that the new well was capped at 20 gallons/minute; our old well was at 10 gallons/minute. The well depth is 72 feet. Ehmke Well Drillers were going to pick up the clay from the well but Park Supt Schweikert noted that it would be perfect for use at the Park; he used it to repair the pitcher's mound. This saved the Town from purchasing clay. The Highway Department were at Community Park earlier today to water the new seed.

8. There was discussion about the Justice Monthly Reports and the difference between the amounts brought in by the two Judges. This could differ because of the number of cases and the types of cases before each Judge; how the troopers and sheriffs write their tickets.

9. Senior Director Eschborn applied for the Oddfellow's grant again for tables and chairs at the Senior Center. The first time the Town did not get it and the Town is hoping for a better chance this year. The Town should know by the end of the month. Since the Town did not get the cooler grant, Supervisor Drozd has been calling the restaurant supply houses and as soon as the Community Park Pavilion is set, he would like to order a cooler for there. These prices are changing daily. The fire department got one with delivery last October for about \$5,100. The Highway Department will assist with moving the refrigerator in when the time comes. Anyone who rents the Community Park Pavilion will be able to use the cooler; nothing will be able to be left in it.

Supervisor Drozd has been receiving calls about renting the new Pavilion and rental fees will need to be discussed for next year. The Town has not yet applied for the Health Department permit.

10. The two boilers in the Utility Room at the Senior Center started leaking; had never been serviced. Reding came; the boilers had the original filters and were never serviced. The filters were changed and the boilers serviced and everything is working.

11. Three quotes have been received for the Senior Center parking lot and he is waiting for another quote for the windbreak at the Center. The one quote did not have the right material which needs to be something clear so people will have a visual.

12. Council Member Zittel did check on the big roller and he did ask Monroe if they had a system for it and they do not but it could be purchased after market. Hwy Supt Edwards wants to get rid of the old backhoe. Hwy Supt Edwards researched getting rid of the backhoe and roller and getting a new roller. Council Member Zittel noted that this would be a good deal. The backhoe does not get used. The Town just spend over \$400 to get the flat tire fixed because of dry rot. The roller Hwy Supt Edwards wants to get is a nice roller, compact so it can be moved around.

13. Deputy Town Historian Jolene Hawkins had her first book published: the book is entitled, "Secrets Buried, The Mysterious Death of Christina Jueller" and is about a cold case from 1936 that explains the circumstances and the investigations of Jueller's murder. Mrs. Hawkins gave a copy to Supervisor Drozd and it is in his office. Congratulations to Jolene! Accolades to her on her achievement. Council Member Zittel also has Mrs. Hawkins looking into the old white building at the Fairview Cemetery.

14. On May 16th, the Highway Department will be crack sealing the Miracle Mile, South Cascade Drive between Main Street and Waverly Street.

15. Council Member Zittel advised that next week, May 15, 16 and 17th, the NYS DOT is putting a blitz on for heavy trucks, trailers.

16. Council Member Zittel has had a few problems with the Fairview Cemetery. He provided copies of Rules and Regulations from another cemetery and asked for their review. Signs can be interpreted differently from person to person. There should be Rules and Regulations established for everyone to follow.

17. The DMV sign was received from Erie County and will be put up at the Concord Senior Center.
