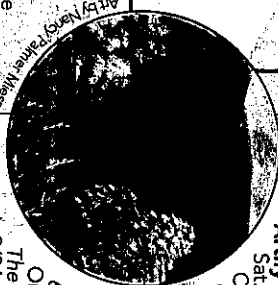
Poetry of the Byway

ART'S CAFE

The Arts Center took on the challenge of redeveloping a collapsed Main Street building and transforming it into a dynamic, arts-based hub that includes a coffee shop with a small performance space, workshop, two artist residences and a public green roof. The remaining work will be funded by community shareholders that can benefit from Federal and State Historic Tax Credits. These credits allow businesses or individuals to pay some of their tax bill into a local project. ENTRANCE ADDITION

Ten years ago we purchased our beautiful church thanks to member donations. Almost immediately we began developing a long-term master plan that would transform the space into a premier multi-arts center. With the completion of the bathrooms and gallery we have our sights set on the next phase of work: an accessible entryway addition on the side of the gallery.

We have recently received significant support from The Cullen Foundation, Ralph C. Wilson Jr. Foundation Fund for Community Assets, and the Community Foundation for Greater Buffalo totalling \$105,000 towards this project! Depending on additional funding, we hope to begin major work next year.

THE ARTS PARSONAGE

You may have heard a little about the Parsonage. Through the generosity of the current owner and the support of our members, SCA is planning to close on the neighboring property in late September. Built by the church on a pre-existing foundation in 1887, this parcel was split from the church after the dissolution of the congregation. After much discussion with the Board of Directors, we decided that, while the timing was challenging, acquiring the property was the opportunity that could not be passed up.



In the beginning, this will have little impact on our programs. The property will be rented out to pay for the balance of the purchase. Over time we will convert the property to the Arts Parsonage, making a major expansion to our internship and residency programs possible. Several feet of the property is needed now to begin work on the above-mentioned Entrance Addition. Join us for volunteer cleanup sessions September 30th and October 14 at 9am.
