ITEM #2. PUBLIC COMMENT

Supervisor Eppolito opened the floor for Public Comment. This is a time for the Board to listen to the Public.

ITEM 4. NEW BUSINESS

a) **Eleanor Eschborn to address the Town Board** – Senior Director Eschborn stated that there has been a lot of controversy so she did a comparison report of the reports she had from 2016 compared to 2017. She could not find any numbers of the activities that were done in 2016 but for the first 10 months of 2017 there have been 571 activities at the Center. She also did a comparison of the foot traffic. For 2016 nothing was under Concord Senior Center; it was under SCENE, Nutrition, the Concord Seniors Club, the Women's Club and Home Bureau and that totaled together was 4,795. She put her activities under the Center and the Nutrition Program and that totaled 10,420 and the Center lost two SCENE groups. The Nutrition Site was open 1 to 2 days per week until June 2017 and then it went to 4 days a week. It is now open 4 days a week if we get the count which is 12-15 people. She thanked the volunteers.

Senior Director Eschborn note:

- The Blood Mobile has been coming to the Senior Center for the last couple of months and they are happy with their move from the Town Hall.
- SASI has been coming twice a month to clean. She had an appreciation party for SASI last week.

- On December 21st she would like to invite all the Town Board members to the Center for lunch. We are going to have Erie County's first Volunteer of the Month from our Center. County Executive Polancarz; the head of the Nutrition Site Mike Saccamanno; Timothy Hogue, the Commissioner of Senior Services and the Town's Supervisor-elect Clyde Drake will be there. Supervisor Eppolito will be out of town.

- She is working with Community Concerns. HEAP came last week.
- Cable TV has been removed from the Center. No one was really watch it.

An antenna was set up and the Center now has 26 channels.

- The Center now has a paper recycler. Newspapers, books, phone books will be taken. The Center will be money back on this.

- The Center's weekly schedule is in the Springville Times which is delivered to each mailbox. She met with the Pennysaver and they are going to charge \$70 to the Town for her ad. She is sorry but she doesn't see that happening. Colleen at the Springville Journal puts in what she can.

- The Fire Company is coming to do a tour on Monday night.
- A windbreak is going to be installed on the front of the building by her husband. It will be removable.

- Senior Director Eschborn thanked Supervisor Eppolito for all the help he has done for her at the Center. Any problems she has had, he has always been there to fix it. She wanted him to know that he helped make the Center great and she knows that Supervisor-elect Drake is going to continue to help the Center.

Councilman Krezmien asked what time the luncheon was on December 21st. It's scheduled for 11:30-12 noon. If anyone wants to attend the lunch, call Nancy to make a reservation. Councilman Krezmien also asked Senior Director Eschborn who she had talked to from the Pennysaver (Mr. Kraft). Councilman Krezmien will follow up with Mr. Kraft.

b) Appropriation Transfer – This appropriation transfer is for the Craneridge Lighting District. Bookkeeper Ciszak noted that due to the added expenses of the new lights project at Craneridge Lighting District, their appropriation line SL5182.49 needs to have funds added to it. The funds will come from their Unappropriated Fund Balance SL599. The entry to be approved by the Town Board is:

This expense is for the two lights that have been installed. The cost of this project will be expensive and will need to be bonded or a ban. Supervisor Eppolito questioned Councilman Snyder if the Homeowners' Association will vote on this project. Councilman Snyder stated that he thinks a Public Meeting should be held to present this project to the residents in Craneridge. Their Craneridge Steering Committee are the ones making the decision; not the Town Board.

Motion by Councilman Krezmien, seconded by Councilman Drake, to approve the appropriation transfer as above detailed. Councilmen Krezmien, Drake, Zittel & Snyder; Supervisor Eppolito, voting aye. Carried.

d) 2018 Budget Modifications – The Public Hearing on these budget modifications was held earlier this evening.

Councilman Snyder moved the adoption of Resolution 17, seconded by Councilman Zittel:

WHEREAS, Town Clerk Schweikert had published the Notice of Public Hearing in the Springville Journal on September 28th, 2017. Said Notice of Public Hearing was also posted on the Town of Concord Website and on the signboard at the Town Hall on September 19th; 2017;

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Concord held a Public Hearing on Thursday, October 12th, 2017;

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Concord adopted the 2018 Budget at their Town Board Meeting held on Thursday, October 12, 2017;

AND, WHEREAS, modifications to the 2018 Budget as adopted are necessary. Town Clerk Schweikert published a Notice of Public Hearing on the 2018 Tax Rates in the Springville Journal on November 30th, 2017. Said Notice of Public Hearing was also posted on the Town of Concord Website and on the signboard at the Town Hall on November 27th, 2017;

e) **Resignation of Deborah M. Barone, Esq.** – Deborah M. Barone, Esq., submitted her retirement letter dated November 21, 2017, to the Town Board for the positions of Town Attorney and Town Prosecutor, effective January 1, 2018. Motion by Councilman Drake, seconded by Councilman Krezmien, to accept the retirement letter of Deborah M. Barone, Esq., with regrets. Councilmen Krezmien, Drake, Zittel & Snyder; Supervisor Eppolito, voting aye. Carried.

f) **SPCA Agreement** – The Town received an updated Agreement from the SPCA and the Agreement has been reviewed by the Board Members and Deputy Town Attorney Attea. Dog Control Officer is satisfied with the Agreement as presented because it is essentially the same Agreement that the Town has always had with the SPCA. SPCA simply increased their fees. Dog Control Officer has no objection to the Agreement since she has worked with this contract for 15 years. Motion by Councilman Krezmien, seconded by Councilman Snyder, to authorize Supervisor Eppolito to sign the SPCA Agreement. Councilmen Krezmien, Drake, Zittel & Snyder; Supervisor Eppolito, voting aye. Carried.

g) **Cold War Vets Exemption** – The Town of Concord approved the Cold War Exemption in August 2008 by Local Law. Assessor Martin stated that when this Exemption was written, it was to expire in 10 years and the 10 year period is up. The language has been rewritten so that all the taxing jurisdictions could opt in to extending the term forever. For the Town to extend the Exemption, a local law would be required. Councilman Drake stated that the Cold War is considered the Korean War to Iraq. Currently there are 51 Cold War Veterans in the Town of Concord. Assessor Martin clarified that Cold War is basically all the Veterans that fell through the cracks of the first Veteran's Exemption. None of them saw combat so they are not eligible for combat; they just get the war time exemption. Some of them are Vietnam. Councilman Drake had Town Clerk Schweikert get the information from when the Town did the Local Law in 2008. Copies of that information have been given to Deputy Town Attea and they will work on forming a new Law so that the Town Board can adopt a law by March 1st, 2018. A Public Hearing will be necessary and will be scheduled in 2018.

h) **Authorize Town Supervisor to Transfer Funds** – Due to the repair at the Town Highway Garage Roof, a transfer of \$10,400.00 from the Building Reserve Fund to the M&T Checking Account is needed. This will be to fund an increase in account A1620.42 Buildings Maintenance.

Bookkeeper Ciszak noted that this transfer was the capital project repairing the highway barn roof and that was not in the 2017 budget. Funds were in the reserve account and Bookkeeper Ciszak needs the motion to allow her to make the entry and authorize Supervisor Eppolito to use the funds for that. George Donhauser asked if the \$10,400 figure was the bid. Supervisor Eppolito noted that there were three bids.

There was one cheaper bid but the bid selected outlined everything that was going to be done. The cheaper bid did not state all the specifications.

Motion by Councilman Krezmien, seconded by Councilman Zittel, to authorize the transfer of funds as above detailed. Councilmen Krezmien, Drake, Zittel & Snyder; Supervisor Eppolito, voting aye. Carried.

i) **Set Organizational Meeting Date** – Councilman Drake, Supervisor-Elect, would like to schedule the Organizational Meeting for Thursday, January 4th, 2018 at 6:30 p.m. and the regular Town Board Meeting to follow at 7:00 p.m. The reason this meeting has to be done a week earlier is to get people in place so that Court can be held the following Monday. Councilman Drake advised the Board that a meeting will be necessary later in the month to pay the bills. There will be no January meeting on January 11th, 2018. Motion by Councilman Drake, seconded by Councilman Zittel, to schedule the Organizational Meeting for Thursday, January 4th, 2018 at 6:30 p.m. with the regular Town Board Meeting to follow at 7 p.m. Councilmen Krezmien, Drake, Zittel & Snyder; Supervisor Eppolito, voting aye. Carried.

j) **Appoint Pam Bartkowski to the Library Board** – Motion by Councilman Krezmien, seconded by Councilman Drake, to approve the re-appointment of Pam Bartkowski to the Library Board of Trustees. Her term is January 2018 to December 2022. Councilmen Krezmien, Drake, Zittel & Snyder; Supervisor Eppolito, voting aye. Carried.

k) **Appoint Karl Lux to the Planning Board** – Councilman Drake stated that Planning Board Member Lux has been conscientious in coming to the meetings and with his history working with the Village of Springville, he has been quite an asset to the Planning Board. Motion by Councilman Drake, seconded by Councilman Zittel, to approve the re-appointment of Karl R. Lux to the Planning Board. His term is January 2018 to December 2024. Councilmen Krezmien, Drake, Zittel & Snyder; Supervisor Eppolito, voting aye. Carried.

l) **Appoint Ray Hubert to the CIDA** - Motion by Councilman Krezmien, seconded by Councilman Drake, to approve the re-appointment of Raymond R. Hubert to the Concord IDA. His term is January 2018 to December 2022. Councilmen Krezmien, Drake, Zittel & Snyder; Supervisor Eppolito, voting aye. Carried.

m) **Mobile Home Court Renewal Permits** – Town Clerk Schweikert asked the Board to approve the renewals of the Mobile Home Court Permit for Springville Mobile Home Park and Perkins Trailer Court. Every year a renewal of their Permit is required. A fee is paid and the Code Enforcement Officer does an inspection of the property. It is difficult for the inspection to take place with the Winter weather. CEO Pirro and the Planning Board have agreed that the renewal could be approved now and the inspection will be done by CEO Pirro in the Spring. This will also allow the residents at these mobile home courts to take advantage of the Town-wide Trash pickup. Town Clerk Schweikert will send the approval letter to the owners of the Mobile Home Courts will note the inspection will be delayed until April. Councilman Krezmien asked Planning Board Member Donhauser if the Planning Board agreed. Planning Board Member Donhauser noted that the Planning Board wants on-going inspections to continue. Town Clerk Schweikert noted that CEO Pirro did a good job working with the owners/residents last year. CEO Pirro put up notices letting the residents know when he would be coming back so they had time to correct the violations; he spoke to the residents personally. The permit is annual calendar year but the inspection can take place at any time which is what Planning Board agreed to. Motion by Councilman Drake, seconded by Councilman Zittel, to approve the renewals of the Springville Mobile Home Park and Perkins Trailer Court with the condition that the inspection will take place in April 2018. Councilmen Krezmien, Drake, Zittel & Snyder; Supervisor Eppolito, voting aye. Carried.

ITEM #7. COUNCILMAN NOTES

a) Councilman Zittel attended a meeting at the East Concord Fire Hall on December 9th regarding the intersection of Route 240 and Genesee Road. It was a very interesting meeting. The County listened to everyone and they are taking their comments into account.

b) Councilman Drake noted that the Comprehensive Plan Meeting was cancelled due to the weather. He will work with Mark Alianello, Town Engineer, to get another meeting scheduled so that we can keep that moving to meet that deadline at the end of March 2018.

c) Councilman Drake thanked Supervisor Eppolito. Since Election Day, he has been spending half days in the Supervisor's Office. He appreciates all Supervisor Eppolito's help who promised that he will only be a phone call away.

d) Councilman Krezmien congratulated Supervisor Eppolito on being named Citizen of the Month and also thank him for everything Supervisor Eppolito has done. A lot has been learned from Supervisor Eppolito and he will be missed. Councilman Krezmien noted that Supervisor Eppolito left the Board in good hands with Councilman Drake.

e) Since this is his last meeting as Concord Supervisor, Supervisor Eppolito wanted to say that it has been a privilege to serve the residents of the Town of Concord for the past 12 years. Looking back, he must say that he has been truly blessed with a group of Councilmen who worked with him often taking responsibility over what he would consider the call of duty.

- Parks Superintendent Krzemien, who is also referred to as the “Commissioner” and treats Community Park as his own backyard. The Town receives constant compliments from the many users. He is a great man and Supervisor Eppolito will miss their conversations.
- Supervisor Eppolito doesn’t want to forget our Highway Crew. It is not an easy task maneuvering the Town roads with those 10-wheelers, sometimes around the clock. They are always there when we need them. He wants to thank the guys for their work.

- Jim Thoman and Butch Wittmeyer whose knowledge and skills have kept the Craneridge Water Treatment Plant operating efficiently for many years. These men do things above and beyond the call of duty up there and save the Craneridge residents a lot of money.

God Bless You and thank you for all your help.

Those in attendance thanked Supervisor Eppolito for service and wished him the best in his retirement.


ITEM #8. MOTION TO ADJOURN
