Supervisor Drake discussed the following:

1. Town of Alden Supervisor Richard Savage sent a letter to the Town seeking our support for the Town of Alden's application for permanent ambulance operating authority in the Town and Village of Alden. Supervisor Drake noted that the Town of Concord knows first-hand how hard this was to do. The April 3<sup>rd</sup> letter was reviewed by the Board members and there was no objection to the Supervisor sending a letter of support. Councilman Krezmien will make a motion during the Town Board meeting tonight authorizing the support letter.

2. New York State Parks, Recreation & Historic Preservation Deputy Commissioner R. Daniel Mackay sent the Town a letter dated April 6<sup>th</sup> stating that the Town Hall building at 86 Franklin Street and the Lucy Bensley Center building at 23 North Buffalo Street have been included in a historic district that will be considered by the New York State Board for Historic Preservation for nomination to the National and State Registers of Historic Places. Listing in the National and State Registers affords properties a measure of protection from the effects of federal and/or state sponsored or assisted projects, provides eligibility for certain federal and/or state tax credits and renders properties owned by non-profits or municipalities eligible for state preservation grants. If a property owner wishes to object to the proposed district, he/she must submit a notarized acknowledgment before the district is listed which according to the letter would be June 7<sup>th</sup>. Town Attorney Attea will look into this matter.
