

Supervisor Drozd discussed the following with the Board:

1. Met at Craneridge at dusk with Sam Lewandowski and Cory Bowen of the Craneridge Lighting last week Thursday, June 1, 2023, to go around and look at the lighting fixtures. Supervisor Drozd asked Council Member Snyder to review the last National Fuel agreement. There was discussion about if the lines would have been pulled out if the homeowners decided to do different lighting.

2. The freezer used by Dog Control Officer Robinson broke and needs to be replaced. A new one would cost about \$350; this freezer is stored at the highway garage. ARPA funds will be used to purchase this freezer.

3. The Town received the Municipal Shelter Inspection Report from the NYS Agriculture and Markets. The shelter services were rated satisfactory.

4. Hamburg Overhead Door completed the Highway Department door repair. This was the repair required by PESH. ARPA funds will be used for this project.

5. On May 24, 2023, Supervisor Drozd declared a State of Emergency for the Kissing Bridge Waste Water Treatment Plant. Erie County Sewer Commissioner Joseph Fiegl has been in contact with Supervisor Drozd advising that he will be at the Town's disposal if anything is needed as this project continues; he could look over the bids received and answer any questions. Commissioner Fiegl will personally come to Concord to look at the two waste water treatment plants.

6. Supervisor Drozd and Council Member Krzemien attended the Houghton training today. One of the sessions was about grants for towns. Grants could be applied for to repair the Bensley Center roof, gutters and windows at the Town Hall, the Highway Department barn roof. It was recommended that the Town put together an Action Plan and also have a grant writer on staff.

7. The Town received the reimbursement checks from the construction of the Community Park Pavilion: \$100,000 and \$35,000 already received. There is a balance of \$15,000 remaining in the grant funds. Alliance Homes advised that the crew will complete the work which will take about 3-4 days.

8. Custodian Ott has been working on tasks at the Bensley Center and the Hulbert Library; keeping the exit light and emergency lights in compliance; as well as a faucet replacement at the Bensley Center.

9. Supervisor Drozd was thanked by Mayor Michaels for the Town's support in removal of the bump out on Franklin Street. The bump out will be taken out and then the Village will repave Franklin Street. The Village also received letters of support from the school district, the Post Office and the Springville Fire Company.

10. On May 17, 2023, Erie County Executive Poloncarz signed into law the Volunteer Firefighters and Ambulance Workers Property Tax Exemption. The tax exemption is now available across the board (village, town, school and county).

11. Caleb Henning will be in attendance for the Board Meeting to explain the proposed Amendment to the April 13, 2022 Contract for the Kissing Bridge Sewer District. The preliminary engineer's capital cost estimate for the project is \$420,000.

12. Hwy Supt Edwards advised that the Revolutionary War plaque noting that a "Revolutionary Soldiers Buried Here-Placed here by NY State Organization NSDAR" which was on a tree at the Spaulding Road Cemetery is missing. Discussion about removal of the dead tree. Hwy Supt Edwards noted that he will work with the Legion and resolve this matter; and the tree removal.

13. Town Clerk Schweikert had a webinar this morning with General Code regarding the Code update. The Planning Board is in the initial stages of their review of the Code.

14. Two Erie County Legislators were in Concord last week where the Community Park Pavilion project was discussed. After that meeting, the Erie County Health Department got the Town the necessary permit to start the water design project.

15. Gold Star Feed & Grain sent in a request to use the Senior Center Parking lot for their Customer Appreciation Day on July 20, 2023. This is the week that the Senior Center is closed but it is also the tentative week to have the parking lot resealed. The Town approved Gold Star Feed & Grain's use last year and there were no issues. If approved tonight, Supervisor Drozd will call Plant Manager and work the use around the Town's schedule.

16. Supervisor Drozd and Council Member Krzemien met with Jeff Smith, Municipal Solutions, today at the Houghton training and discussed the NYS DEC Violation fine for the Kissing Bridge Waste Water Treatment Plant. Mr. Smith recommends that the Town pay the reduced fee. Since the Town received the NYS DEC Consent Order and the fine, this should help the Town going forward with grant applications.

17. The Chamber of Commerce provided the Town with a list of items that were left at the Bensley Center. These donated items include plastic supplies (cups, etc.), a desk and hutch, metal file cabinets and assorted office supplies
