TOWN HIGHWAY LAW – SECTION 214

DEPOSITING ASHES, SNOW, ICE, STONES, STICKS, ET CETERA UPON THE HIGHWAY

Any person who shall deposit or throw loose stones in the gutter or grass adjoining a town highway, or shall deposit or throw upon a highway, ashes, papers, snow, ice, stones, sticks, or other rubbish, shall be liable to a penalty not to exceed one hundred dollars to be sued for and recovered by the town superintendent. No stone or other rubbish shall be drawn to and deposited within the limits of any highway, except for the purpose of filling in a depression or otherwise improving the highway, and only with written consent and under the direction of the town superintendent.

TOWN OF CONCORD CODE – ARTICLE IV – SECTION 142-10

WINTER PARKING – PARKING RESTRICTIONS

No vehicle shall be parked on any county or Town highway in the Town of Concord, outside the Village of Springville, during the period of November 1 of each year through April 1 of each following year during the hours of 11:00PM to 7:00AM prevailing time.

NEW YORK STATE VEHICLE & TRAFFIC LAW – SECTION 1219

- (a) No person shall throw or deposit upon any highway any glass bottle, glass, nails, tacks, wire, cans, snow or any other substance likely to injure any person, animal, or vehicle upon such highway.
- (b) Any person who drops, or permits to be dropped or thrown, upon any highway any destructive or injurious material or any material which interferes with the safe use of the highway shall immediately remove the same or cause it to be removed.
- (c) Any person removing a wrecked or damaged vehicle shall remove any glass or other injurious substance dropped upon the highway from such vehicle.
